

Attached is the statistical data for last years crimes. Keep in mind that statistical data in and of itself can be misleading.

Here are some things that you should know:

- This data reflects reported crime only. Not everyone reports crime.
- This report reflects crimes that were reported in the calendar year 2010.
- The people who committed the reported crimes could be in jail or in another community now, no longer posing a threat to our community.
- Any area can turn around and be a pleasant place if more good neighbors like you reside there.

When considering relocation, it is advantageous to:

- Visit the neighborhood at various hours of the day, on several days.
- Check to see if there is adequate parking for your needs.
- Is the noise at a tolerable level for you?
- Check the lighting at night.
- Do you feel safe there?
- Walk and talk to the neighbors and ask them about the neighborhood.
- Is there much graffiti?
- Are there dogs running loose?
- Is there much traffic?

Only you can decide what kind of neighborhood you want for yourself.

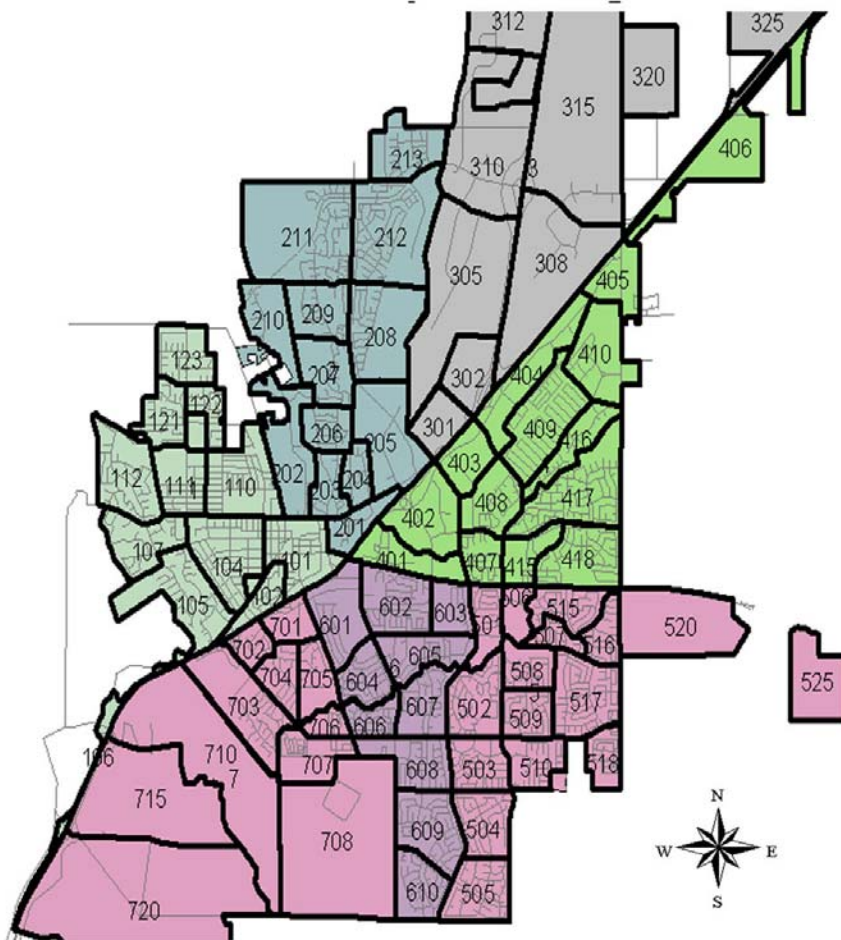
