

## INVITATION FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

Dear Community Members,

The County of Solano and Cities of Vacaville, Fairfield, and Vallejo have been allotted \$124,002 by the Federal Bureau of Justice Assistance under the 2019 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Formula Program.

In accordance with the requirement of the grant, the County and Cities designated the City of Vacaville as the fiscal agent to apply for the funding on behalf of all the eligible agencies in the County and to administer the grant.

In order to maximize the benefit to each agency and the community they serve, the agencies collectively decided it was best to allow agencies to develop individual spending plans within their own allocation of JAG funds.

These spending plans are as follows:

**City of Vacaville** - \$15,319 – Funding will be used for specialized police equipment.

**City of Fairfield** - \$32,849 – Funding will be used for specialized police programs.

**City of Vallejo** - \$68,226 – Funding will be used for specialized police equipment.

The primary goals for this funding are to retain jobs to support law enforcement programs and to provide technology, equipment and supplies to enhance the capabilities of law enforcement.
