POLICE SEEK SUSPECT IN SECOND SHOOTING IN TWO DAYS

Vacaville police are seeking a suspect in the shooting of a woman Thursday evening, the second shooting incident in Vacaville in two days.

Police received a call at approximately 10:47 p.m. Thursday of a shooting in the 1400 block of Alamo Court. Police responded and found a Hispanic female adult suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. She was treated at the scene by Vacaville paramedics and then transported to a local hospital where she underwent surgery. She is currently listed in stable condition and is expected to survive. Her name is not being release at this time.

Initial reports from witnesses state that a short argument took place between two groups of young people just prior to the shooting. The argument occurred in a common area of an apartment complex located on Alamo Court. Investigators are not sure if the victim was the intended target.

Detectives from the Investigative Services Section (ISS) and the Crime Suppression Team (CST) responded to the scene and are continuing the investigation. Detectives are looking into the possibility that this crime is gang related. Witnesses said the weapon used was a handgun.

This is the second shooting incident in Vacaville in two days. On Wednesday, a Fairfield man was shot in the area near Trower Park. It has not been determined if the two cases are related. Updates will be provided as necessary.
