Narrative:

On November 15, 2012 at approximately 5:30 a.m., patrol officers responded to an alarm call at the T-Mobile Store on at 1639 East Monte Vista Avenue. Upon their arrival, Officers saw evidence of a forced entry into the closed business. With the help of the Vacaville Fire Department, Officers gained access to the roof, and ultimately forced entry into the business. Located in a crawl space above the ceiling, Officers discovered S-Yakimov. S-Yakimov was in possession of burglary tools which he had used to gain access to the business, as well as electronics equipment worth in excess of \$4,000.00. S-Yakimov was arrested without incident.


Located in S-yakimov's vehicle (which was parked nearby), Officers found evidence of additional burglaries which had occurred in the city of Vacaville. S-Yakimov's M.O. (modus operandi) was identical during both burglaries, in that he made entry into the business through the roof.

Detectives from the Investigative Services Section (ISS) responded and began assisting with the investigation. Additional evidence was located that tied suspect S-Yakimov to several more recent burglaries. S- Yakimov was subsequently arrested for a burglary that occurred at the Hisui 2 restaurant located on Alamo Drive. This crime had occurred on November 13, 2012 with a loss of cash and personal property. S-Yakimov was booked on two counts of commercial burglary for his crimes committed in Solano County. A booking photo has been attached to this press release.

Detectives' also uncovered evidence indicating that S-Yakimov was responsible for three more commercial burglaries in the Sacramento area. The Vacaville Police are working with Sacramento investigators on these crimes. Detectives are also investigating the possibility that S-Yakimov is responsible for other crimes in our community.

As we approach the holiday season this type of criminal behavior unfortunately increases. The Vacaville police would like to remind our community to secure valuables and be aware of your surroundings. Please report any suspicious activity to the police immediately.
