VACAVILLE PD ARRESTS TWO FOLLOWING HIGH-SPEED PURSUIT

Vacaville police arrested two men late Wednesday night on a variety of charges after a high speed pursuit ended when the suspects crashed their vehicle.

At approximately 11:30 p.m. on November 28, 2012, officers were conducting a burglary suppression when they observed a man standing by a car with another car parked adjacent to it. The man appeared to be trying to get into the car and seemed startled as the officer drove closer. As the officer drove past the cars, one of cars appeared stripped of parts. The license plates, trim, mirrors and other parts were missing.

The suspicious male got into the second car and tried to leave the area, driving east on Woodcrest Drive towards Browns Valley Parkway. The officer saw that the passenger seated in the right front passenger seat appeared to be the same subject who had been seen at the stripped car.

The officer activated her emergency lights and siren to stop the suspect car, but the driver failed to stop and accelerated to speeds of 80-90 miles per hour. The officer initiated a pursuit and followed the car south on Browns Valley Parkway as the car continued to accelerate. The car approached the curves in the roadway in the 100 block of Browns Valley Parkway at a high rate of speed, causing the officer to slow down her vehicle. However, the suspect lost control of his car, struck the west curb and hit several street signs. The collision disabled the car and it came to rest on the sidewalk behind Wells Fargo Bank. More officers arrived on the scene and the driver and passenger were detained. There were no injuries to the suspects or officers.

The investigation showed the stripped car had been stolen from Sacramento earlier in the day. The driver, S-Sean Maurice Rushton, 21, of Sacramento was arrested for 12022.1 PC, Crime on bail (Felony), 2800.2 CVC, Evading a Police Officer (Felony), 10851 CVC, Stolen Vehicle (Felony), 182 PC, Conspiracy (Felony), 466 PC, Possession of burglary tools (Felony), 496 PC, Possession of stolen property (Felony), and 1460I.1a CVC, Driving on a suspended drivers license (Misd).

The passenger, S-Anthony Leyva, 22, of Sacramento was arrested for an outstanding warrant out of Sacramento County (25662(a) B&P \$20,500), 466 PC, Possession of burglary tools (Felony), 10851 CVC, Stolen Vehicle (Felony), 496 PC, Possession of stolen property (Felony), and 182 PC, Conspiracy (Felony). S2-Anthony Leyva admitted to being a member of the Norteño criminal street gang. S-Leyva and S-Rushton are both affiliated with gangs in Sacramento.

The suspects were booked into the Solano County Jail in Fairfield. S-Rushton's bail was set at \$50,000 and S-Leyva's was set at \$40,500.
