Narrative:

On September 28, 2012, the Burberry Store in the Vacaville Premium Outlets was the victim of a commercial burglary. In this crime, two black male adults entered the store and stole over \$20,000.00 worth of purses and hand bags. The suspects fled without paying for the merchandise.

On October 8, 2012, the Gucci Store in the Vacaville Premium Outlets was the victim of an armed robbery. In this incident, four to five black males entered the store and robbed the employees at gun point. The loss in this case was over \$13,000.00.

The Vacaville Police Department's Investigative Services Section (ISS) began investigating these two crimes and felt they were related. Detectives were able to tie the two Vacaville crimes to numerous similar burglaries and robberies throughout Northern California.

S-Jules Hollis was identified as a responsible in both Vacaville cases and several other crimes in other jurisdictions as well. An arrest warrant for him was obtained on November 8, 2012. As S-Hollis resides in the City of Fresno, Vacaville detectives were working with Fresno law enforcement to assist us in taking S-Hollis into custody. On November 14, 2012 S-Hollis was arrested by the Fresno Police Department. He is currently being housed on robbery and burglary charges in the Fresno County Jail on our warrant with a \$150,000.00 bail (mug shot attached).

The investigation is ongoing and investigators are hopeful more arrests will be made and additional criminal cases cleared. This case was made possible by several law enforcement agencies and retail crime prevention organizations in California coming together and working together. The sharing of intelligence and resources made this arrest possible. The Vacaville Police Department is determined to make this holiday season as safe and pleasant as possible for our citizens and people visiting our city.
