POLICE SEIZE MARIJUANA, CASH, WEAPONS AND ALLIGATOR DURING DRUG ARRESTS

Vacaville police discovered something unusual during the service of a search warrant recently when they came across a baby alligator in the home of two suspects in a marijuana operation in Fairfield.

On January 31, 2013, Vacaville police conducted a traffic stop on a freeway in Modesto and arrested S-Lori Riley, 34 and S-William Riley, 37, both of Fairfield. The Rileys had approximately 50 pounds of processed marijuana with a street value of \$250,000 and a handgun in their possession. They were transported back to their home in Fairfield, where a search was conducted.

During the search, officers found additional marijuana, seven firearms - including one .50-caliber bolt action rifle - over \$29,000 in cash and a three-foot-long baby alligator. The baby alligator was turned over to Solano County Human Animal Services.

As part of this investigation, two additional search warrants were served by Vacaville Narcotics Enforcement Team (NET) and Crime Suppression Team (CST) members at two homes in Vallejo. Both residences had indoor marijuana grows totaling over 900 marijuana plants. No additional arrests were made.

Both S-Lori Riley and S-William Riley were booked into the Solano County Jail on charges of transportation of marijuana; possession of marijuana for sale; possessing a .50 BMG rifle; possessing an assault weapon; and being armed with a firearm in the commission of a felony.
