Narrative:

On April 2, 2013 at approximately 3:51 p.m., the Vacaville Police Communications Center received multiple calls reporting a vehicle versus bicyclist in the 1100 block of Burton Drive.

The fire department and police department arrived and located the bicyclist lying in the roadway of Burton Drive. The bicyclist was conscious. A Spanish speaking sergeant responded and assisted paramedics in gathering preliminary information from the bicyclist, who was Spanish speaking.

The initial investigation revealed the driver of a Toyota Corolla was southbound on Burton Drive in the number one lane when the bicyclist rode his bicycle eastbound, across the southbound lanes of Burton Drive. The front of the Corolla impacted the left side of the bicycle and rider. The rider was ejected from the bicycle and collided with the Corolla's windshield.

The bicyclist was transported by Vacaville Fire Department ground ambulance from the scene to the area of the Ulatis Cultural Center. The bicyclist was then transported by air ambulance to John Muir Medical Center in Walnut Creek.

The bicyclist sustained a head injury, arm injury, and ankle injury. At the time of this writing John Muir Medical Center could not provide further details reference his injuries.

The driver of the Corolla was not injured.

Driving Under the Influence was not a factor in the cause of the collision.
