## **TWO KILLED IN HEAD-ON COLLISION ON VINE STREET IN VACAVILLE**

Two people were killed and four others were injured Sunday afternoon following a head-on collision between two vehicles on Vine Street.

Vacaville police and fire units responded to a 9-1-1 call of a major injury accident in the 100 block of Vine Street at 3:09 p.m. Sunday afternoon. When they arrived, they discovered a Mazda Miata and a Honda Civic had been involved in a head-on collision. Two occupants of the Mazda, an adult male (the driver) and adult female (passenger) were pronounced dead at the scene. Their names are being withheld pending notification of relatives.

The driver of the Honda Civic, a 19-year-old Vacaville resident, was taken by air ambulance to UC Davis Medical Center where he was treated for fractures to his right leg, broken teeth, and a partially collapsed lung. He is listed in stable condition at this time.

Three passengers in the Civic, all male juveniles, suffered a variety of injuries. Two 17-year-olds were taken to Kaiser Hospital in Vacaville, where one was treated for a fractured thumb and released, while the other was admitted to the hospital for a fractured collarbone and abdominal pain.

A third passenger, a 16-year-old, was transported by ground ambulance to North Bay Medical Center in Fairfield where he was admitted and is being treated for lacerations to his arm and a fracture in his lower back.

A preliminary investigation showed the Mazda was traveling southbound in the 100 block of Vine Street at a high rate of speed. The Civic was also in the 100 block of Vine Street headed northbound. The Mazda was unable to negotiate a curve in the roadway and drifted into the northbound lane of traffic, colliding with the Civic head on. It is apparent speed played a major role in this collision and it is unknown at this time if drugs or alcohol were involved. An autopsy for the occupants of the Mazda has been tentatively scheduled for Tuesday.
