Narrative:

On February 18, 2014 at approximately 8:38 a.m., the Vacaville Communications Center received numerous 9-1-1 calls for a shooting in the area of Leisure Town Road near Alamo Drive. Citizens reported that one vehicle was being chased by a second vehicle at a high rate of speed on southbound Leisure Town Road. The vehicle giving chase was reportedly shooting at the fleeing vehicle during the high speed chase.

Officers arrived on scene and found one vehicle that had sustained a gun shot to the windshield. This vehicle was not involved in the chase, but was an innocent bystander driving northbound on Leisure Town Road.

The vehicle chase appears to have started near the intersection of I-80 and Leisure Town Road. The chase ended when the suspect vehicle collided with another innocent bystander's vehicle that was driving near Vanden Road. Witnesses reported that both vehicles were driving erratically and estimated speeds at over 90 mph.

No injuries were reported to the police concerning this incident. Police recovered what is believed to be the suspect's vehicle near the scene. The vehicle was found abandoned and damaged. The suspects have not been located or identified at this time. Witnesses reported that the suspect vehicle was occupied by two people both armed with handguns. The suspects were described as black male adults in their 20's. A large section of Leisure Town Road was closed for approximately two hours while a crime scene inspection was completed.

Detectives from the Investigative Services Section (ISS) responded to the scene and are working on the case. It is not known if this case is related to Fairfield's recent shooting but investigators are looking into that possibility.
