### **UPDATE – ARREST MADE IN SHOOTING ON MEADOWS DRIVE**

Vacaville police have made an arrest in an incident that occurred September 14, 2014 when a man fired into a home in the 100 block of Meadows Drive.

Detectives from the Vacaville Police Department's Crime Suppression Team (CST) and Investigative Services Section (ISS) identified a suspect in the case, a 17-year-old Vacaville resident. On Saturday evening at about 10:38 p.m., CST detectives made a traffic stop on a vehicle near Browns Valley Parkway and Sunrise Drive. One of the passengers in the vehicle was the suspect, who was arrested and booked into Juvenile Hall in Fairfield.

### **ORIGINAL PRESS RELEASE: POLICE SEEK SUSPECTS IN SHOOTING ON MEADOWS DRIVE**

Vacaville police are looking for a man neighbors say fired a handgun at them while they relaxed on the backyard patio of their home on Meadows Drive Sunday afternoon.

Police received a 9-1-1 call from a resident at 3:23 p.m. Sunday saying they were socializing with another couple on their patio, which is enclosed by a half-wall, when a man approached the outside of their patio and made comments to them just prior to firing several rounds from a handgun at them.

The victims on the patio were able to quickly move out of the way and narrowly missed being struck. The shooter then fled the scene on foot with at least three other people.

Officers were able to locate several bullet holes in the patio wall and elsewhere in the backyard. Bullets also penetrated into the kitchen area of the home. The case is currently under active investigation.

The shooter was described as a Hispanic male in his late teens or early 20s with either short or pulled back hair. Anyone who was a witness or has information about this incident is encouraged to contact either Officer Andy Polik or Officer Dave Novelli at (707) 449-5200.
