POLICE ARREST NORWALK RESIDENT FOR PARENTAL ABDUCTION

Narrative:

On January 2, 2015 at approximately 6:44 P.M., Vacaville police received a telephone call from the Los Angeles County Sheriffs Department requesting assistance with a parental child abduction case. Detectives from the Los Angeles County Sheriffs Department were working a case in which a parent who was the non-custodial parent refused to return two children after a court ordered visitation. Investigation showed the parent had no intention of returning the children, ages: 4 and 7.

Detectives exhausted all leads in southern California. The investigation lead detectives to believe the non-custodial parent and children were in the City of Vacaville. Detectives sought an arrest warrant for the parent and the two children were entered into the State of California Missing and Unidentified Persons System (MUPS).

The Los Angeles County Sheriffs Department notified the Vacaville Police Department that the suspect and children were possibly in two separate locations in Vacaville. Detectives from the Vacaville Narcotics Enforcement Team (NET), along with Vacaville patrol officers conducted surveillance of the two locations. At 9:07 p.m. the suspect was located and taken into custody. The two juveniles were taken into protective custody and released to the custody of Solano County Child Welfare Services where they are pending reunification with their custodial parent. The Vacaville Police Department viewed the safety of the children as paramount and the case was brought to a safe and successful conclusion based upon interagency cooperation.
